We are inviting Langdon School Council Society (LSCS) to participate in an ambitious and much needed Accessible Playground build, taking place in Indus during the Summer of 2018. This community-built playground will be a priceless legacy of community spirit in the South East Rocky View area. It will be a rally point for the community members. Regardless of age, ability, sex, economic background, race or culture; everyone will work together and towards this common goal. With this goal comes the pride of ownership that will stay with the community.

Indus is needing to replace our expired playground equipment. The current playground has been well used and has well surpassed its life expectancy.

This equipment:

- is rusting making sharp edges, or bars that are unusable
- weathered wooden platforms that has aged and has many splintered areas and have gaps between boards that pinch the kids,
- many pieces that no longer work,
- not accessible to anyone with mobility issues.

The Proposed Accessible Playground will be an important part of our children's education, personal growth and development. The installation of accessibility within a playground is often thought of as a "choice" or that it is an "option"- at Indus we know that there is no decision to be made. Higher needs students are drawn to the expertise and smaller class sizes at our school. Of the approximately 220 students each year, there are always some with significant mobility issues. Ultimately, we expect our Playground to be fully accessible to the benefit of all.

Our mission is to create a beautiful space where families can gather, play, share ideas and build a sense of community. We envision a playground that serves the South East Rocky View area, that is safe and accessible to everyone. On the surface we will measure success by the smiles on faces, and the increased activity of all our children and community members. A mother, injured in a car accident and using crutches, could now access the play area...a father with a spinal cord injury could now transfer to the U-Swing and swing with his children....a boy with Cerebral Palsy could swing with his sister...this is how we will know we have reached success.

We are hoping that LSCS would consider supporting our community venture by donating \$1000 towards our fundraising goal. This donation will receive permanent, on-site signage, to further

reflect our commitment for community cooperation. We appreciate your time, and look forward



to continuing our journey together.
